SPECIAL BY-LAWS FOR VEGETABLES

1. Entry forms must be received by **Friday February 28 2025 (No late entries will be accepted)** can be completed online at www.coomashow.com.au or delivered/posted to Lorayne Roberson 69 Commissioner St Cooma.
2. **All exhibits to be delivered on Thursday evening March 6 2025 between 6:30pm and 7:30pm or between 7:30am and 9:30am on Friday March 7 2025** to the Cooma Showground Multifunction Centre.
3. **Judging to start at 10:00am on Friday 7 March 2025.**
4. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor or a member of their household.
5. Junior is an exhibitor 17 years of age and under
6. **STANDARD UNIT:** A standard unit for any particular vegetable is shown in vegetable classes: eg 3 carrots. 12 beans, 1 long cucumber, 3 apple cucumbers
7. **AOV:** Any Other Variety
8. **Entries can be collected from 6pm onwards on day of show, Saturday March 8 2025. Entries and/or prizemoney not collected on this day will be forfeited.**

GENERAL HINTS ON EXHIBITING VEGETABLES

Vegetables must be true to type. A variety may have several types, but entry shall be all of the same type. The size, shape and colour should be identical.

TOPS: Vegetables such as carrots should be shown with the tops cut back leaving about 75-100mm of the top on. This should be fresh, without wilting or other damage.
